

# Washington County Economic Indicators November 2022 (October 2022 Data)

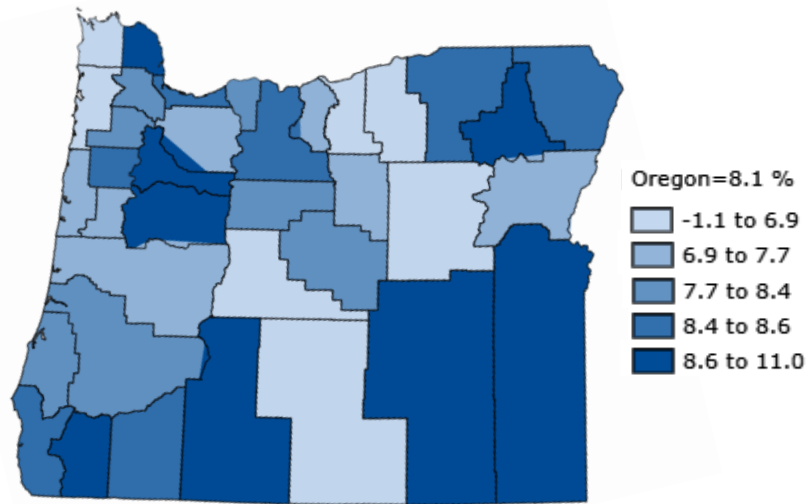
Washington County's unemployment rate shifted little between September and October, ticking up slightly to 3.1%. This is lower than the rate in October 2021 of 3.5% as well as the 20-year average of 5.5%.

While total employment saw a slight monthly gain at 600 jobs, industries were largely divided. Increased employment in sectors like government or private education and health services were balanced out by losses in construction and leisure and hospitality. However, employment remains above pre-pandemic levels and Washington County has more than 6,700 jobs in October 2022 compared with last year.

The graph-of-the-month comes from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis looking at personal income per capita. Compared with Oregon's overall 8.1% growth to \$61,596 in personal income per capita, Washington County's grew 7.9% to \$71,537.

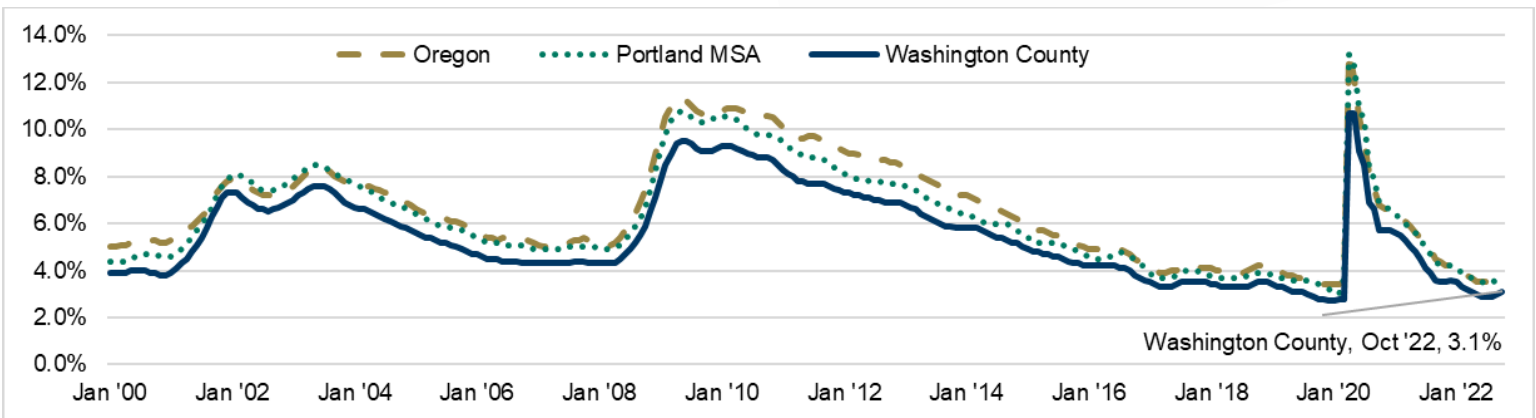
## Personal Income Per Capita Rises in All But One Oregon County from 2020 to 2021

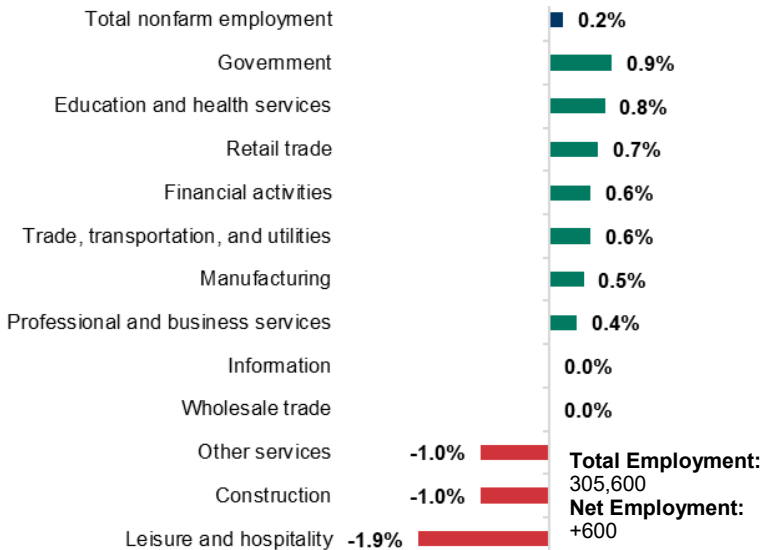
## Unemployment in Washington County was Essentially Unchanged Between September and October 2022

Local Area Unemployment Statistics



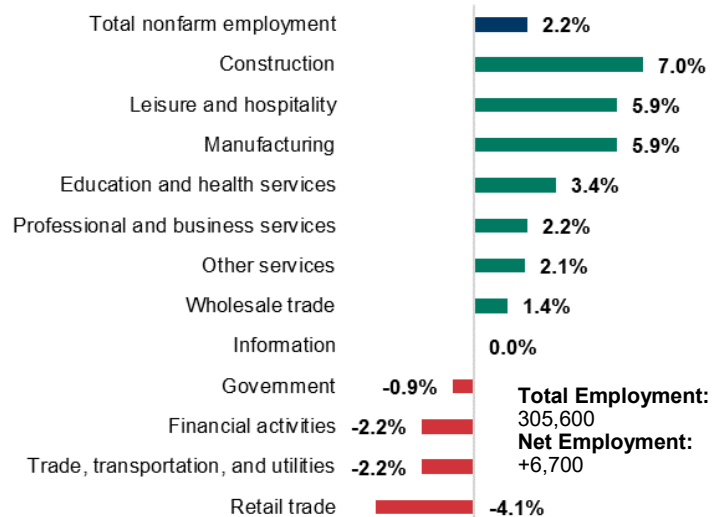
## Total Employment in Washington County Remains Essentially Unchanged as We Entered October 2022
