## Vehicle Code Books - Correction

### OREGON VEHICLE CODE

The 2015-2016 Oregon Vehicle Code Book is the most current edition of the publication. The book is updated following each odd-year regular session of the Oregon Legislature. The current edition was published following the 2015 legislative session, and does **not** include any changes resulting from legislation passed during the legislative sessions held in 2016, 2017, or the recently concluded 2018 legislative session.

The Office of the Legislative Counsel has recently published the 2017 edition of the Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS), which includes changes adopted through the end of the 2017 regular session. DMV is currently working to publish the 2017 edition of the Oregon Vehicle Code, which will include all changes through the end of the 2017 regular session.

The 2017-2018 Oregon Vehicle Code Book is expected to be available for purchase in late spring or early summer of 2018. Ordering information for the book will be provided when the publication becomes available. Until the new edition is available, orders for the Oregon Vehicle Code Book will be filled with the current (2015-2016) edition.

## Subpoenas For Administrative Hearings (*Implied Consent and Other OAH Cases*)

DMV and OAH Are Requesting Email Addresses to Send Subpoenas to Police Officers

In late February, DMV and the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) sent out a message via LEDS. The message explained that the two agencies were working together to address a problem that had been brought forward regarding some police officers not timely receiving subpoenas to DMV hearings as their police agency did not daily check the LEDS terminal. Representatives from the OAH and the DMV DUII policy section met with a standing committee that DMV has with law enforcement officials to discuss how to efficiently send subpoenas to officers. This committee agreed that a central email address for each agency would be the best method.

Therefore, OAH is asking that each agency provide the requested e-mail address for your agency no later than close of business on April 20, 2018 to Cheryl Lien at [cheryl.l.lien@oregon.gov](mailto:cheryl.l.lien@oregon.gov).

OAH plans to begin sending subpoenas for DMV hearings by email on June 1, 2018.
