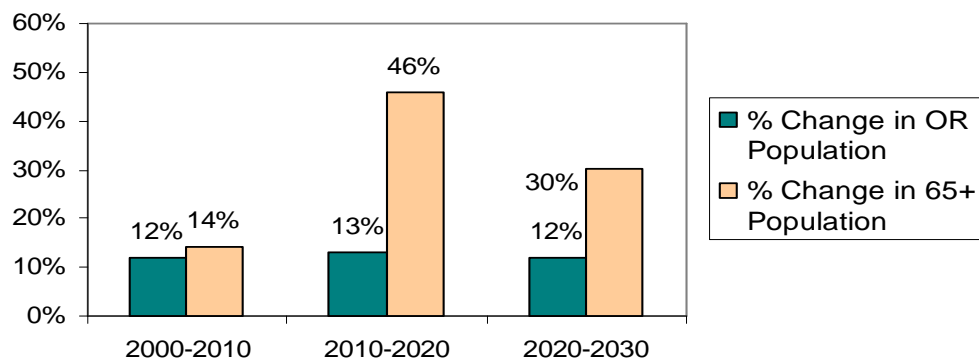

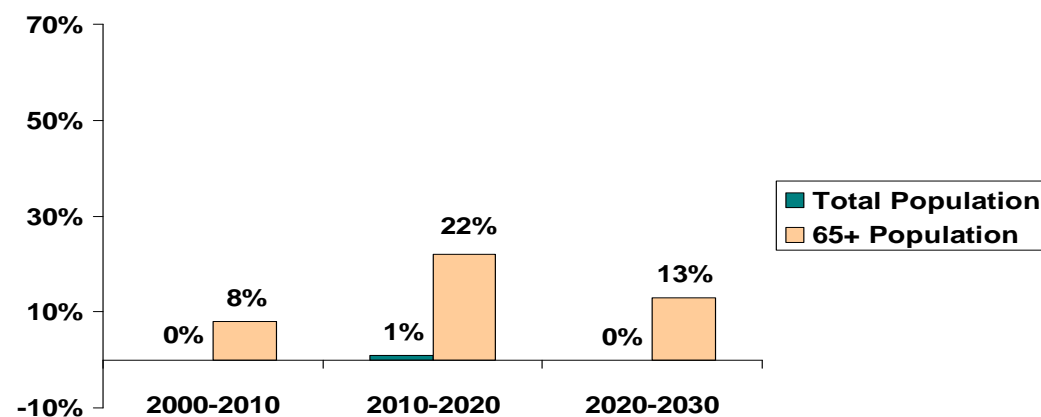

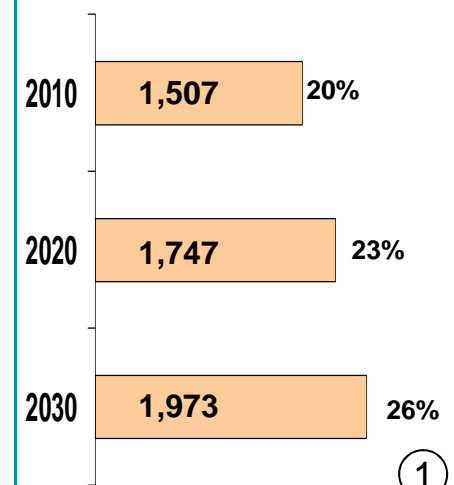
Growth Rate of Oregon's Aging Population

Lake County Projected 65+ Population and % of general population



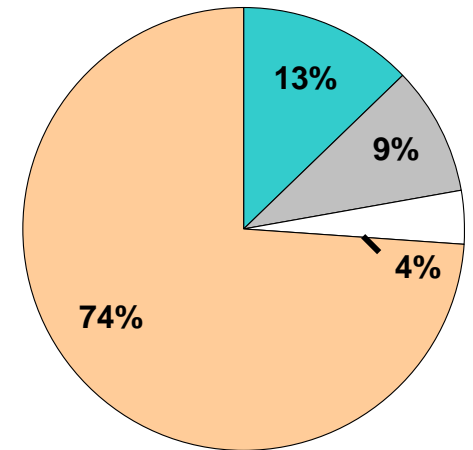
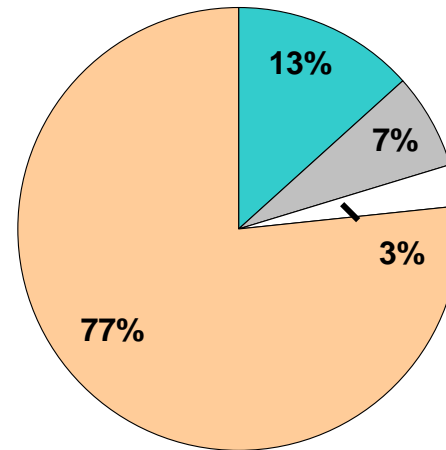
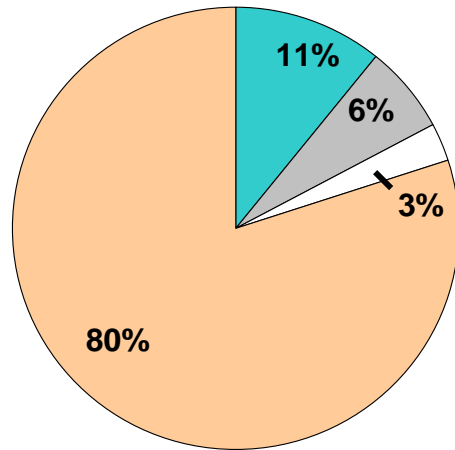

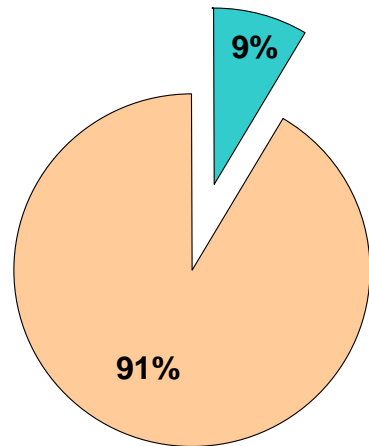

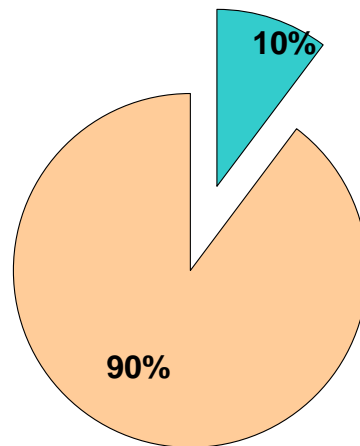

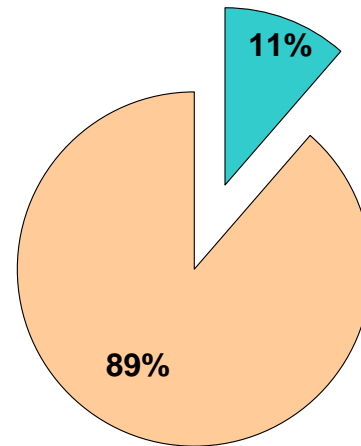

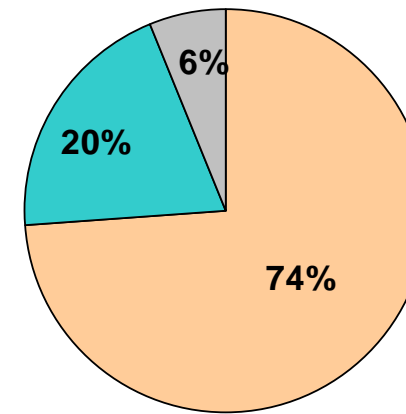

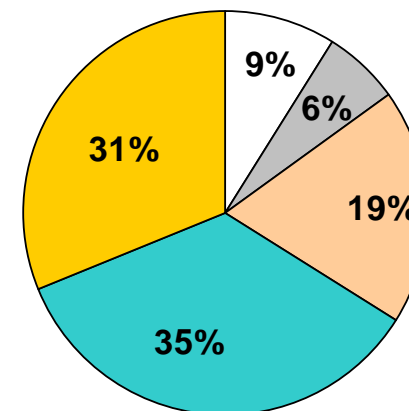
National % of Seniors Needing Assistance Due to Disability

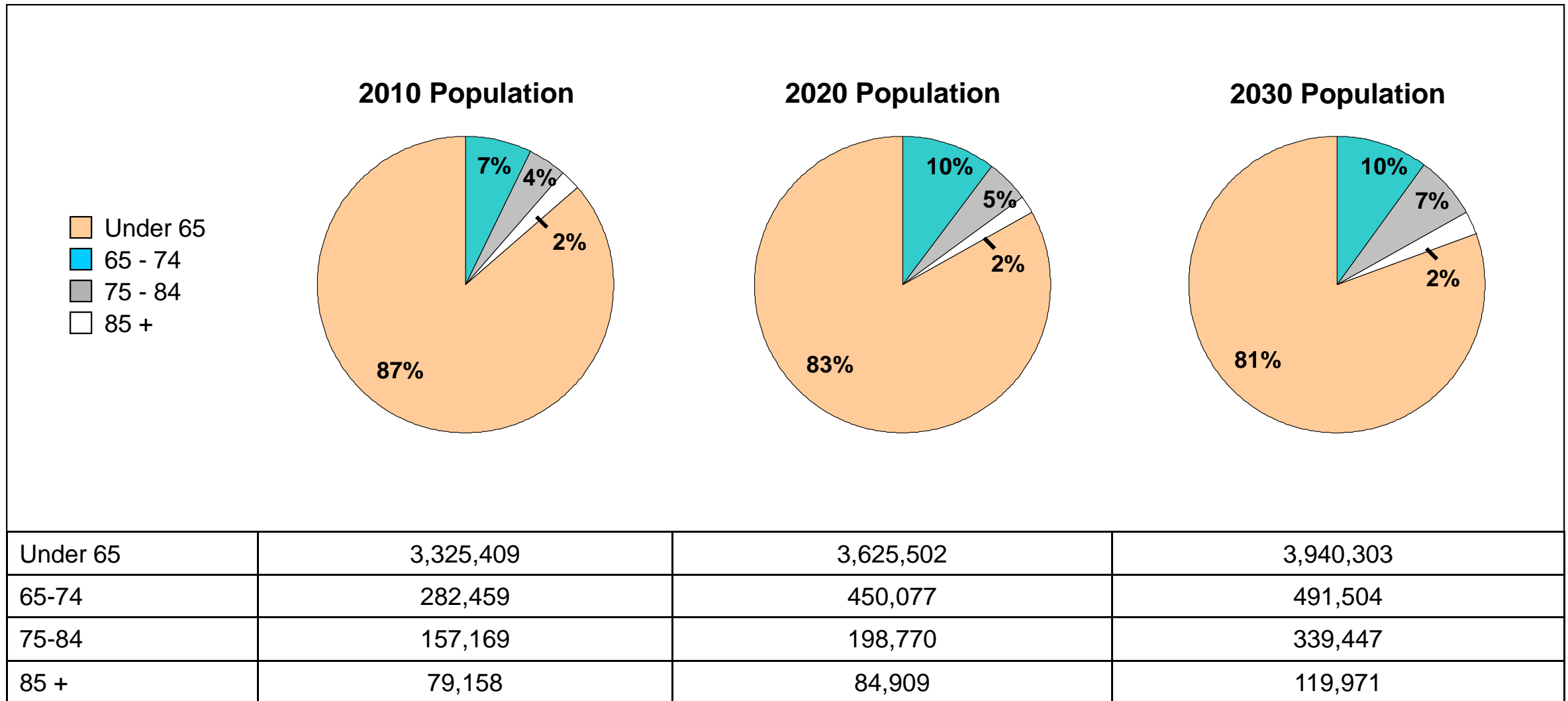
National % of Seniors and Federal Poverty Level (Monthly Income)
