Women In Need of publicly funded contraceptive services and supplies **69**

Women In Need (WIN) are between 13 and 44 years old, fertile, sexually active, neither intentionally pregnant nor trying to become pregnant, and at an income below 250 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL). Women In Need may require public assistance to get services and avoid unintended pregnancy.

Access

Clients benefiting from public investment in family planning dollars* **13 (93%)**

*Includes clients covered by Title X and Family Planning Expansion Project (FPEP) monies. Free or low-cost services are available for these clients to reduce barriers to care.

Clients with limited English-language skills..... **0**

Most Family Planning clinics have Spanish-speaking staff, offer culturally appropriate services, and produce client materials in Spanish and other languages.

Family Planning clinics reach Oregonians who traditionally have difficulties getting services they need. These underserved clients include low-income clients, those in rural communities, who are incarcerated, those with limited English-language skills, and many others.

Statewide Family Planning Facts

- 1. *Family Planning builds strong families by:***
 - Keeping young adults healthy and productive;
 - Providing basic health care for women;
 - Helping women have healthy pregnancies;
 - Allowing parents to devote more time and resources to each child; and
 - Helping families achieve economic security.
- 2. *Family Planning provides essential health services to low-income and uninsured individuals.*** In addition to contraceptive services, Family Planning provides a link to primary health care, prenatal and obstetric care, and other preventive health and social services.
- 3. *Family Planning results in cost-savings.*** Every year, Oregon Family Planning:
 - Leverages nearly \$20 million in federal funding (\$9 in federal funds for every \$1 the state contributes for direct services);
 - Reduces the number of publicly funded births by preventing unintended pregnancies; and
 - Saves \$5 for every \$1 spent.
- 4. *Family Planning makes a difference in Oregon by contributing to:***
 - A greater opportunity for education for all family members, particularly girls and women;
 - A healthier and more productive work force capable of achieving higher rates of personal savings and economic growth;
 - Reductions in unintended pregnancies, sexually transmitted infections, HIV/AIDS, infertility and abortions; and
 - Savings in public expenditures related to other health and social services.
