

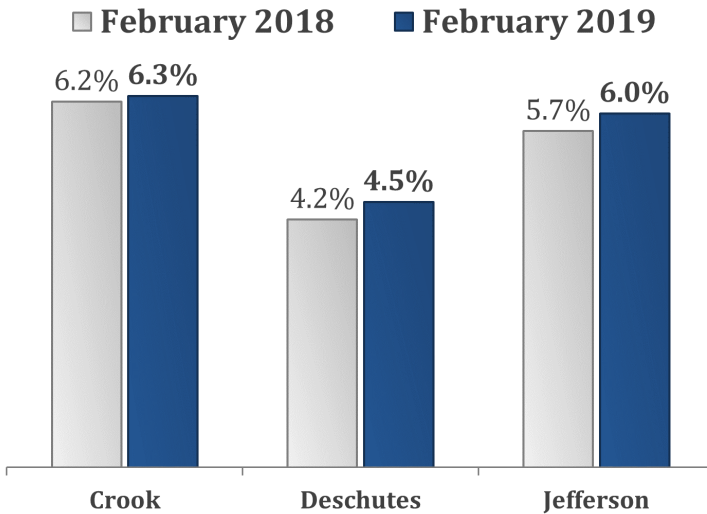

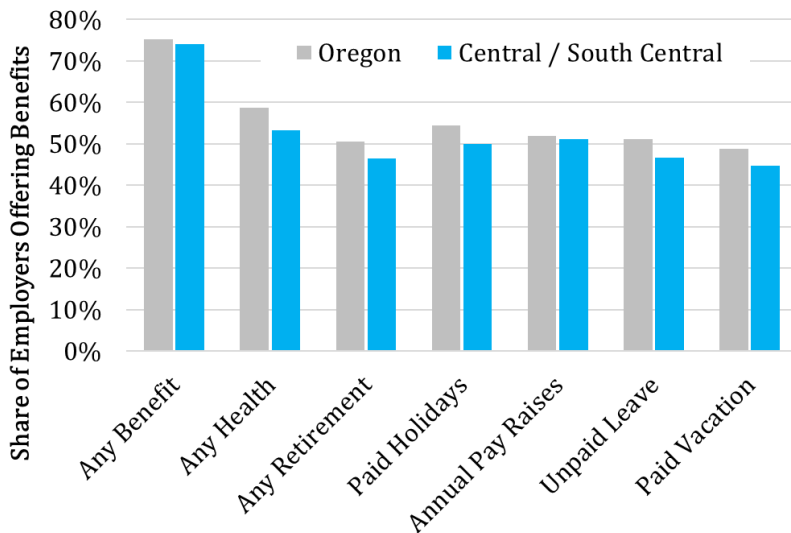

## Graph of the Month How Many Local Employers Offer Benefits?

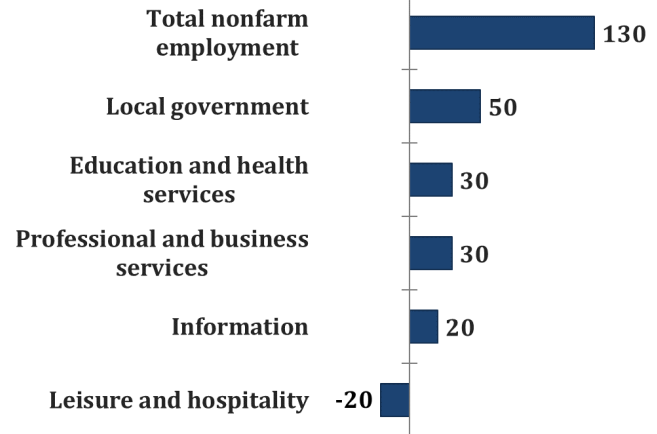

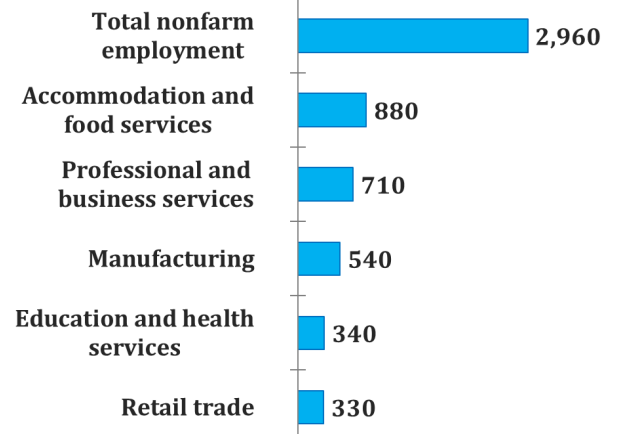
Employer-provided benefits data is really difficult to come by, so we sent out a survey trying to capture the characteristics of firms and the benefits they extend to their employees. Nearly 4,600 employers responded yielding fascinating results in our report. The share of employers providing benefits in Oregon was highest among larger employers and technical sectors such as information, professional and technical services, and health care. Metro areas have a higher share of large employers and jobs in technical sectors, explaining why the Portland MSA and Willamette Valley have a higher share of employers offering benefits.
