Employment in Tillamook County: January 2015

Employment Unchanged for the Month

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment was unchanged in January at 8,680 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. A loss of 120 nonfarm jobs was expected for the month and that is how many the county lost. The private sector cut all 120 jobs and government employment was unchanged. Leisure and hospitality shed 70 jobs and retail trade cut 40.

January's total nonfarm employment was 290 more than one year before. The private sector added 270 jobs and government chipped in 20. Industries adding the most jobs included retail trade (+90), professional and business services (+60), educational and health services (+50), and food manufacturing (+30).

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.9 percent in January, essentially unchanged from the previous month (6.1%) and the year before (6.3%). It was about the same as the statewide rate (6.3%) and the national rate (5.7%).

The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
