# Oregon businesses reported 62,800 vacancies in summer 2019.

## Oregon Job Vacancies, Summer 2019

<b>Vacancies</b>	<b>62,783</b>
Average Hourly Wage	\$17.95
Full-time Positions	75%
Permanent Positions	90%
Requiring Education Beyond High School	29%
Requiring Previous Experience	53%
Difficult to Fill	63%

Total job openings were essentially unchanged (-1%) from summer 2018.

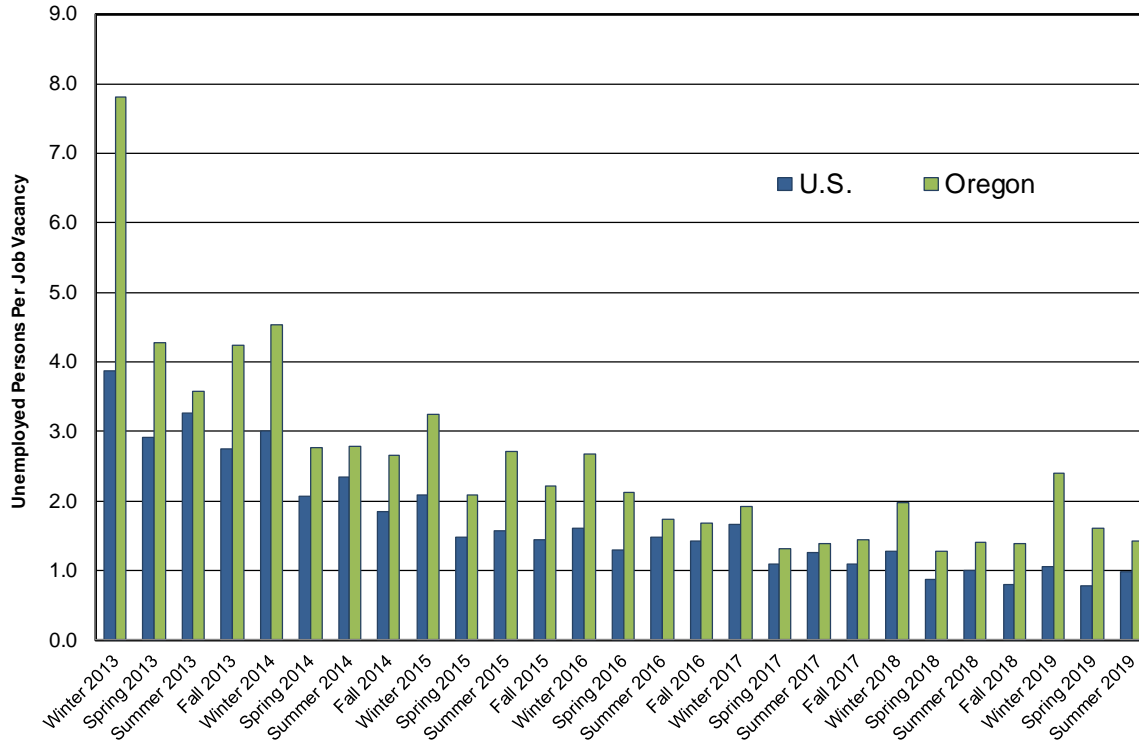
A typical job vacancy tends to be for a full-time, permanent position.

# The labor market remains tight in Oregon and across the U.S.

Oregon and the U.S. have both had a 1-to-1 ratio of unemployed persons to job openings for three consecutive summers.

# Businesses reported strong hiring in several industries.

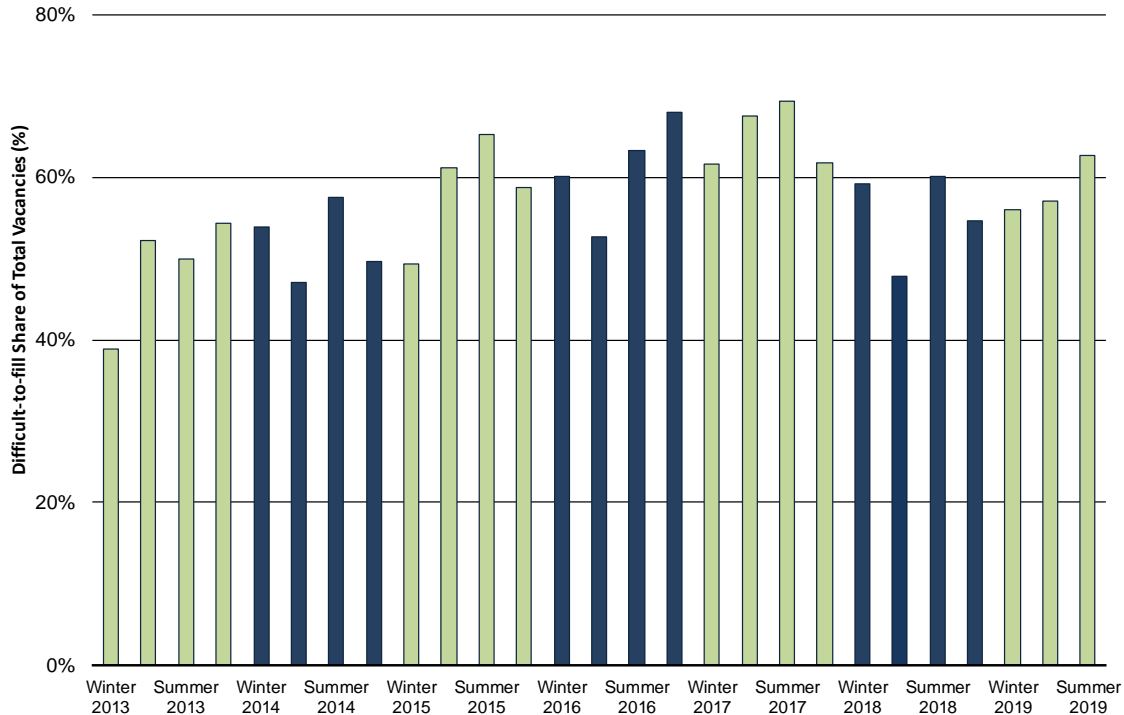
Private health care and social assistance accounted for one out of every five job vacancies in Oregon during spring 2019.

Hiring remained broad-based across the economy, with at least 2,000 vacancies in all but two relatively small private industry sectors.



# The majority of job vacancies are reported as difficult to fill.

## Businesses Report Difficulty Filling Six of 10 Vacancies in 2019



In a long economic expansion with almost three years at or near record low unemployment rates, the most common reason employers cite for difficulty filling vacancies is a lack of applicants.



# The starting wage for job vacancies averaged \$17.95 per hour in summer.

Inflation-adjusted average starting wages rose by about \$1 per hour between summer 2018 and 2019.

Over the year, the only increase in job vacancies by education requirement was for openings requiring at least a bachelor's degree (+400).

Seasonal hiring demand included leisure and hospitality and retail in several areas, while the Mid-Valley saw higher seasonal demand in agriculture.

The Portland tri-county area accounted for 39 percent of all job vacancies statewide.
