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Employment in Tillamook County: August 2019

Employment Dipped By 20 More than expected in August

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment slid by 20 in August to 9,560 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. Stable employment was expected for the month, but the county lost 20 jobs. Private-sector employment decreased by 20 jobs, and government employment was unchanged. Leisure and hospitality cut 20 jobs over the month. Other industries had smaller changes.

August's total nonfarm employment was 280 more than one year before, a gain of 2.9 percent. The private sector added 90 jobs over the year, and government gained 190 jobs. Leisure and hospitality and construction each added 40 jobs over the year. State government added 90 jobs and local government including education grew by 80 jobs over the year.

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.2 percent in August. It was essentially unchanged from the previous month (4.1%) and the year before (4.4%). It was about the same as the statewide rate (4.0%) and close to the national rate (3.7%).

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
