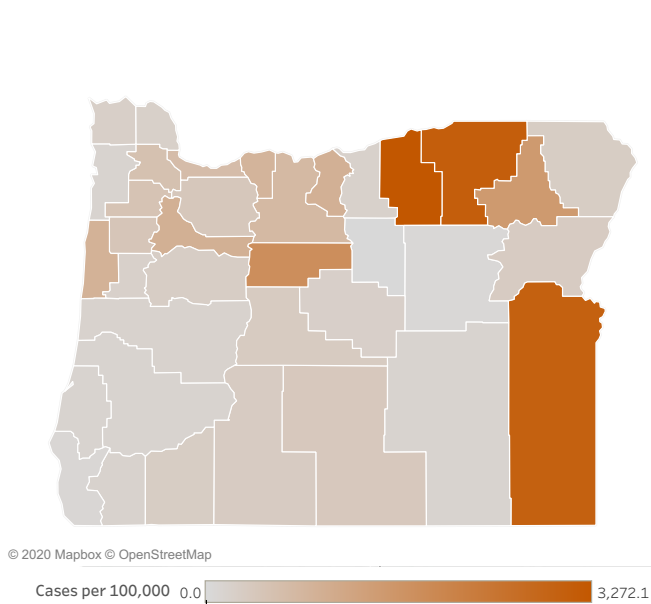

## Oregon's COVID-19 Testing and Outcomes by County

This map shows the number of COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people by county in Oregon.\* The number of cases in a community depends, in part, on the number of people who live there. Looking at the numbers this way helps us compare counties of different sizes more evenly than total case counts alone.

Hover over a county in the map below to see the total number of cases, recovered cases, deaths, and positive and negative tests in that county. The table s..

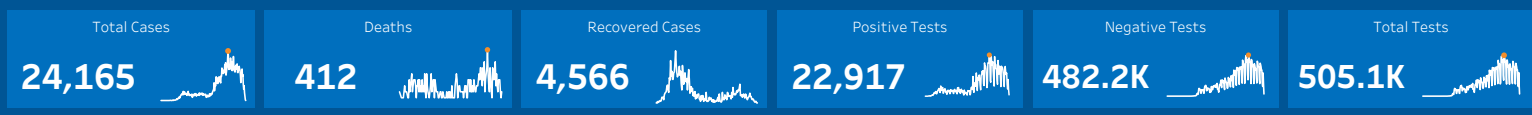

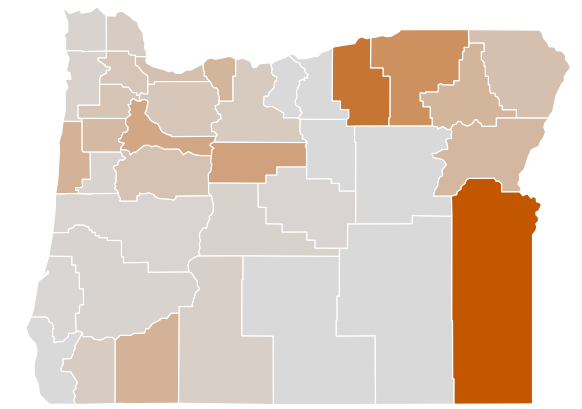

Percent Positivity  Total Persons Tested

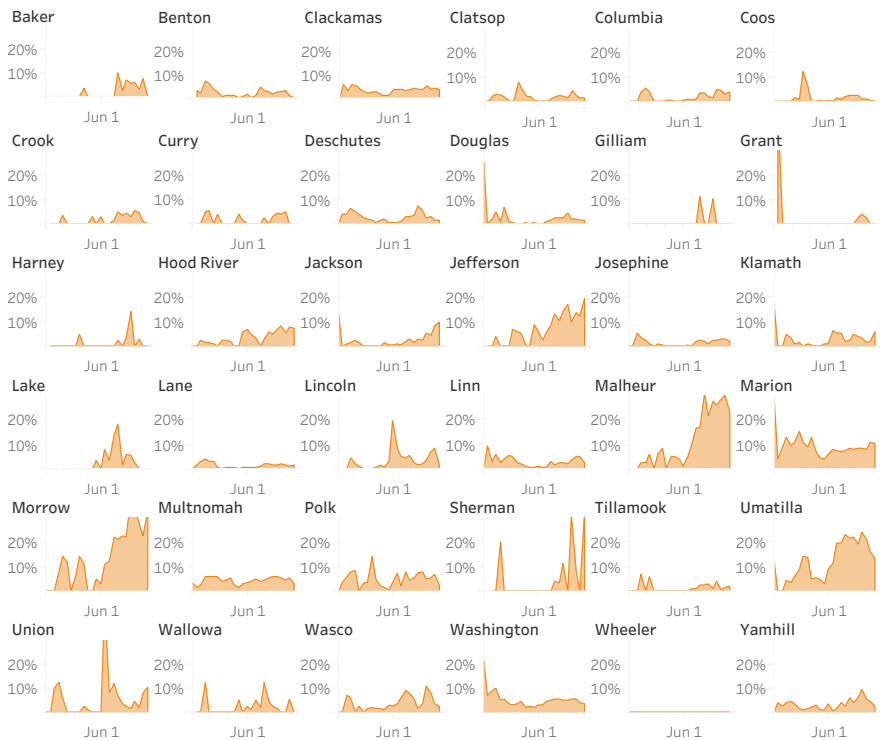
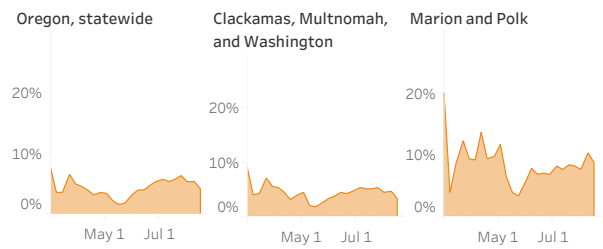

\* Counties with a population of 80,000 or less are displayed with a maximum axis of 1,000 tests per week, counties with a population of 81,000 to 500,000 are displayed with a maximum axis of 5,000 tests per week, and counties with a population greater than 500,000 are displayed with a maximum axis of 9,000 tests per week.
