People 80 and older now eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccine

As of Monday, Feb. 8, 2021, people who are 80 years of age or older can begin getting vaccinated against COVID-19. Oregonians who fall into this category can use the new [Get Vaccinated Oregon](#) tool to get linked to information about vaccinations in their counties. Residents of Clackamas, Columbia, Marion, Multnomah or Washington County may schedule vaccine appointments through the Vaccine Information chatbot featured on this page. Alternatively, you may text ORCOVID to 898211 (English and Spanish only) or email ORCOVID@211info.org for registration information. If you can't find the answers to your COVID-19 questions on our website, by text, or by email, you can call 211 or 1-866-698-6155 (open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily, including holidays). Wait times may be longer due to high call volumes. Residents and staff at most licensed facilities for older adults and people with disabilities are receiving on-site vaccinations through pharmacies enrolled in federal vaccination programs.

¹This includes cases confirmed by diagnostic testing and presumptive cases. Presumptive cases are people without a positive diagnostic test who have COVID-19-like symptoms and had close contact with a laboratory confirmed case. Antibody test results are **not** included in our data. County of residence for cases may change as new information becomes available. If changes occur, we will update our counts accordingly.

³This includes cases who test negative and are not epi-linked to a confirmed case.

⁴Ever hospitalized, if available, as reported to OPERA. OPERA is the state of Oregon's electronic disease surveillance system for COVID-19. Cases are considered hospitalized if they were ever admitted to the hospital for inpatient care during the their COVID-19 illness. Cases who were examined in but not admitted to a hospital may be incorrectly classified as hospitalized until interview and medical record review are complete, leading to fluctuations in the number of hospitalized COVID-19 cases.

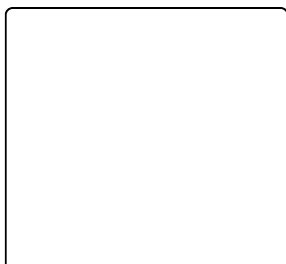
