Oregon's Hospital Bed Capacity by Region

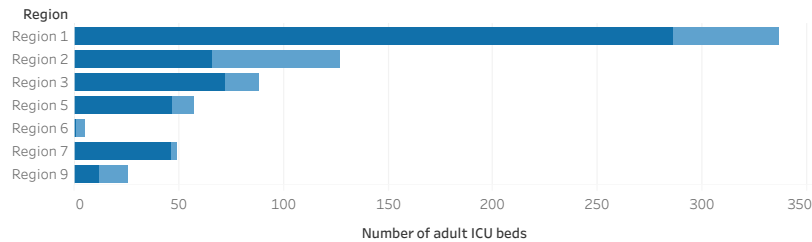
These charts show how many hospital beds are available and being used in each Hospital Preparedness Program Region¹ as reported to Oregon's Hospital Capacity Web System (HOSCAP)². Hospitals report staffed and available beds to HOSCAP; based on these numbers, OHA calculates how many beds are being used. Staffed beds are the number of beds that a hospital has staff and equipment to support.

The total number of patients in hospital beds may fluctuate between report times. Numbers do not reflect admissions per day nor the length of hospital stay. **Staffing limitations are not captured in this data and may further limit bed capacity.**

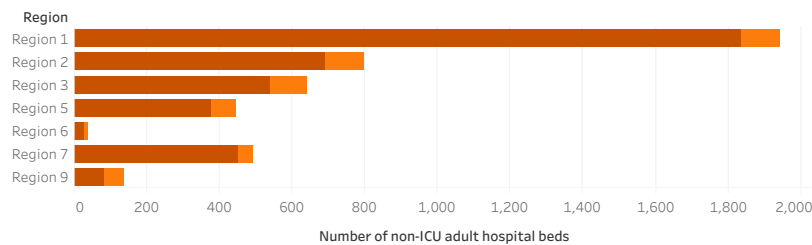
This data does not show the maximum capacity of hospitals. Should more patients need to be hospitalized for COVID-19 or other health conditions, hospitals may need to repurpose other types of hospital beds, and/or postpone or cancel elective procedures in order to maximize staff and bed capacity in hospitals.

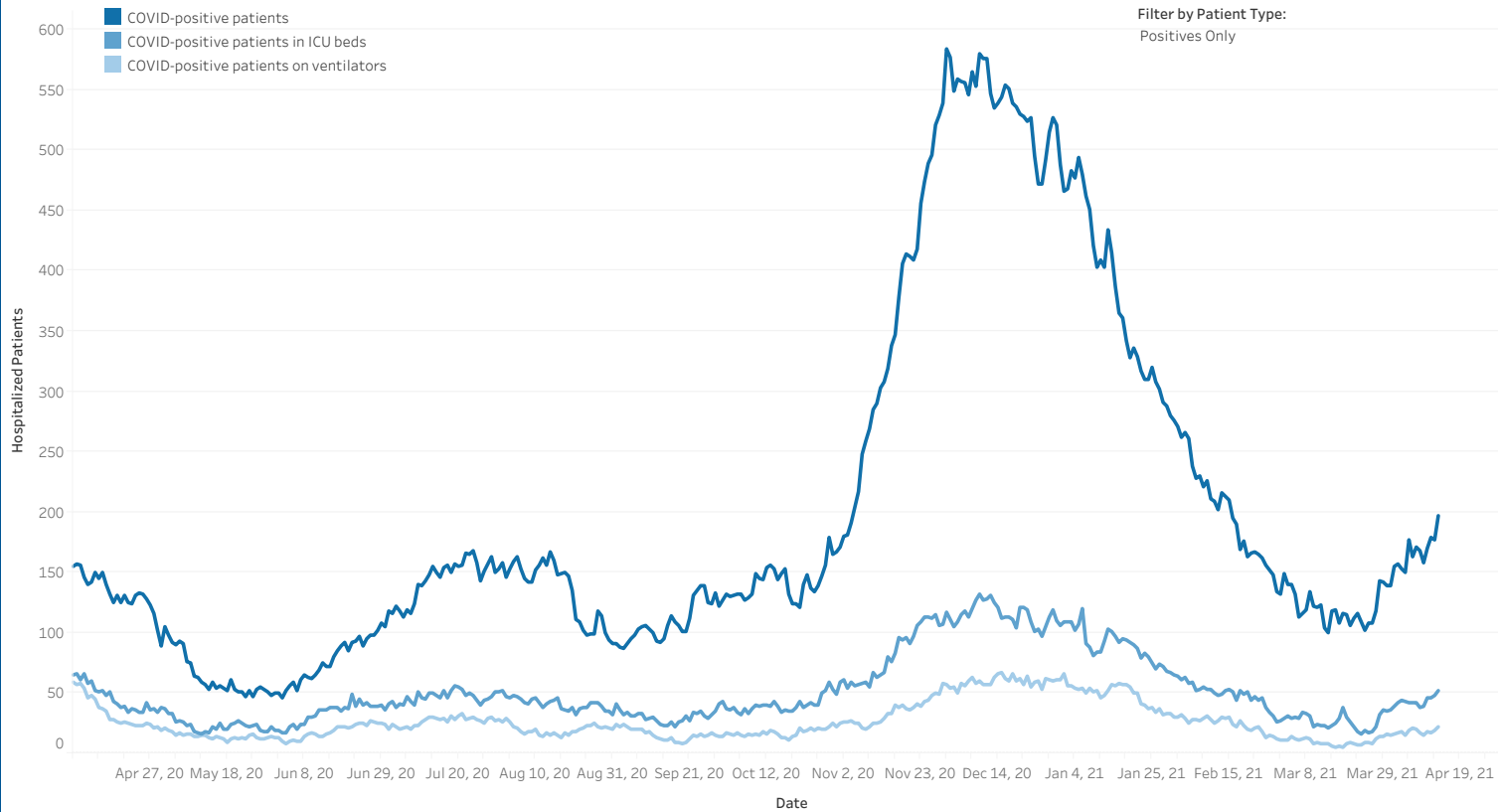

Oregon's Hospitalization Trends by Severity

This chart shows daily COVID-19 hospitalizations and whether patients were in the ICU or on ventilators, as reported to Oregon's Hospital Capacity Web System (HOSCAP)¹. It initially displays only those who tested positive, but you can view all suspected or confirmed patients² using the dropdown menu below. Click on a legend item to highlight it in the chart (ctrl+click to select multiple items).

¹ Every hospital in Oregon is asked to submit data twice daily to Oregon's Hospital Capacity Web System (HOSCAP). Data are based on the most recent report from the hospitals. The above hospitalization data is different than other reports on the OHA website, as these data are from HOSCAP and not from OPERA (Oregon's electronic disease surveillance system for COVID-19). HOSCAP reflects the current day's number of hospitalized patients who have confirmed or suspected COVID-19 as reported by hospital staff. OPERA relies on public health interviews with confirmed and presumptive COVID-19 patients to determine whether they were hospitalized during the course of their illness, which results in reporting delays.

² On May 4, 2020, the definition of "suspected or confirmed" was clarified to mean only those patients who were hospitalized specifically for COVID-19 or COVID-19-like illness and that it should not include patients being tested for COVID-19 that were otherwise not suspected to have COVID-19. Counts prior to this date may overestimate the number of suspected COVID-19 hospitalizations in these data.

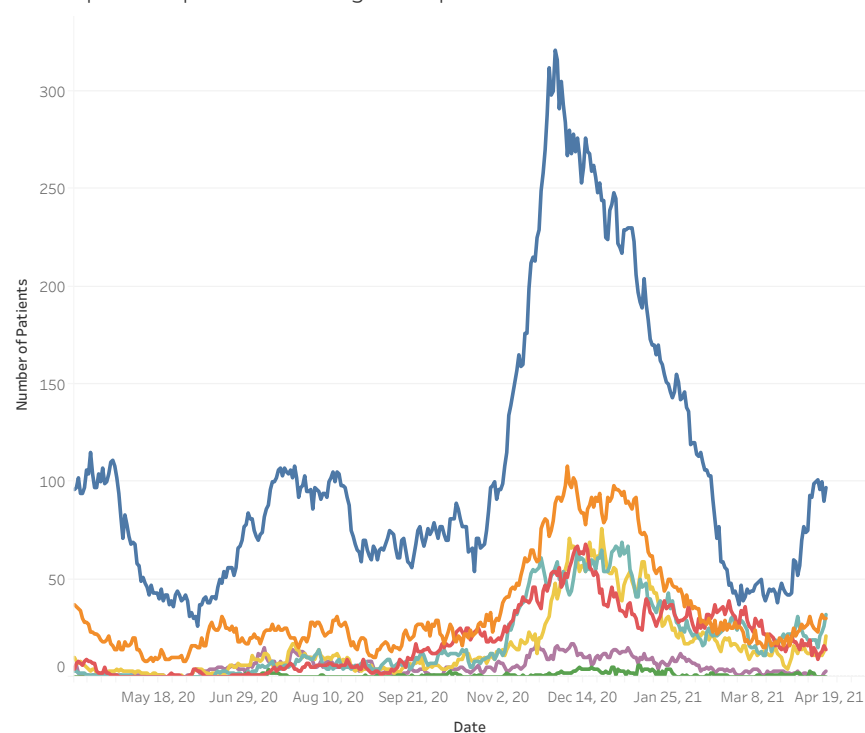

Oregon's Hospitalization Trends by Region

This chart shows COVID-19 hospitalization trends by Hospital Preparedness Program Region¹ as reported to Oregon's Hospital Capacity Web System (HOSCAP)². Use the dropdown menu to choose the type of hospitalization³ and/or click a region on the map to filter the chart (ctrl+click to select multiple regions).

¹ Region refers to the location of the hospital, not the residence of the patient. Regions 4 and 8 exist in southern Washington state and are not counted in Oregon tabulations.

² Every hospital in Oregon is asked to submit data twice daily to Oregon's Hospital Capacity Web System (HOSCAP). Data are based on the most recent report from the hospitals. These data may conflict with hospitalization status in Opera due to case reporting and investigation lags and temporary discrepancies in case classification.

³ On May 4, 2020, the definition of "suspected or confirmed" was clarified to mean only those patients who were hospitalized specifically for COVID-19 or COVID-19-like illness and that it should not include patients being tested for COVID-19 that were otherwise not suspected to have COVID-19. Oregon PPE by Hospital

Each week, hospitals report how much PPE they have to Oregon's Hospital Capacity Web System (HOSCAP)¹:

- *Amount of PPE on hand* is the number of PPE items the hospital currently has (for example, how many gloves).
- *Burn rate* is the average number of items used per day over the last week.
- *Days on hand* are the estimated number of days that the hospital's current PPE would last if they did not receive more.

¹ Oregon Health Authority asks every hospital in Oregon to submit PPE data to Oregon's Hospital Capacity System (HOSCAP) each Monday by noon. Data are based on the most recent report from hospitals.

Additional Information:

- OHA recently changed the way we collect PPE information in HOSCAP, so you may see some discrepancies in the data. As we continue to refine the process, we will improve data quality.
- Some health systems report combined PPE for all of their hospitals. These combined reports are marked "(HEALTH SYSTEM)".
- Veterans Affairs hospitals receive their PPE from the federal government and do not report PPE to HOSCAP.
- OHA does not require behavioral health hospitals to report PPE to HOSCAP because they are not expected to treat COVID-19 patients.
