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## **Employment in Tillamook County: May 2021**

### **Seasonally adjusted employment unchanged in May**

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment was unchanged in May at 8,960 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. Employment was expected to grow by 110 jobs, and the county added 110 jobs. The private sector added 70 jobs, and government employment was up by 40. Food manufacturing added 40 jobs. Other industries had smaller changes.

May's total nonfarm employment numbers show a gain of 1,090 jobs compared with one year before, an increase of 13.7%. The county lost 1,370 jobs in April 2020 as the pandemic hit, and it remains 630 jobs below its pre-pandemic employment of May 2019. Nearly every major industry gained jobs over the past year. Leisure and hospitality regained 540 jobs. Retail trade recovered 150 jobs. Manufacturing added back 90 jobs.

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 6.2% in May, essentially unchanged from 6.3% in April. It was 14.1% the year before. The statewide unemployment rate was 5.9% in May, and the national rate was 5.8%.

The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
