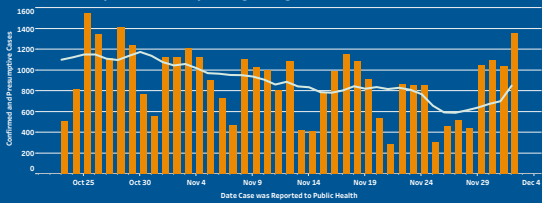

\*\* On September 23, 2023 the CDC added a classification of Variants Being Monitored. This classification includes variants previously designated Variants of Interest (VOI) or Variants of Concern (VOC) that are no longer detected or are circulating at very low levels in the United States, and do not pose a significant or imminent risk to public health in the United States.

▲ The daily patient number aggregates the period between 8:00:02 a.m. on 12/2/2021 and 8:00:02 a.m. on 12/3/2021. The disaggregation of these times can be seen on the Variant Dashboard. There is a time lag of approximately two weeks between when a sample is collected, sequenced and then reported by GISAID. This chart reflects that time lag.

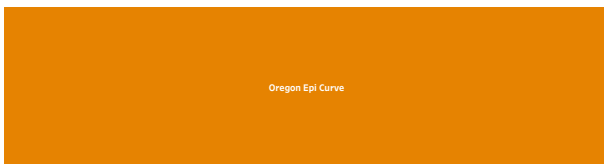

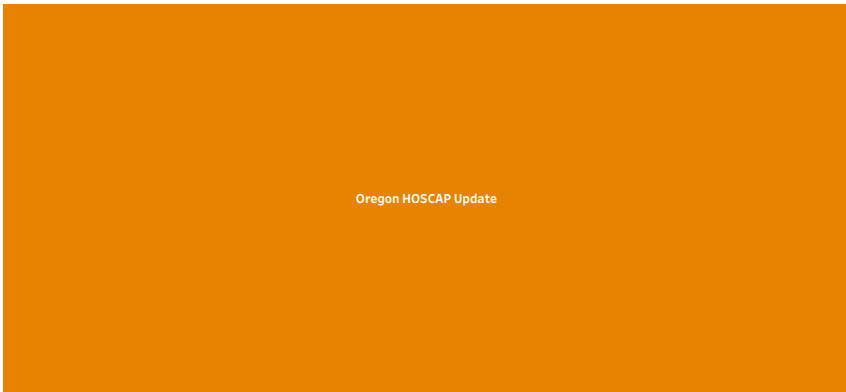

 \*\*Total COVID-19 patients\*\* include any patient who has either suspected COVID-19 or a positive COVID-19 test.  
 \*Every hospital in Oregon is asked to submit data twice daily to Oregon's Hospital Capacity Web System (HOSCAP). Data are based on the most recent report from the hospitals, available as of 9:00am. Hospital staff are asked to enter bed capacity information, by type, as well as the number of patients with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 illness who are currently hospitalized at the time of data entry. These data may conflict with hospitalization status in Orpheus due to case reporting and investigation lags and temporary discrepancies in case classification.

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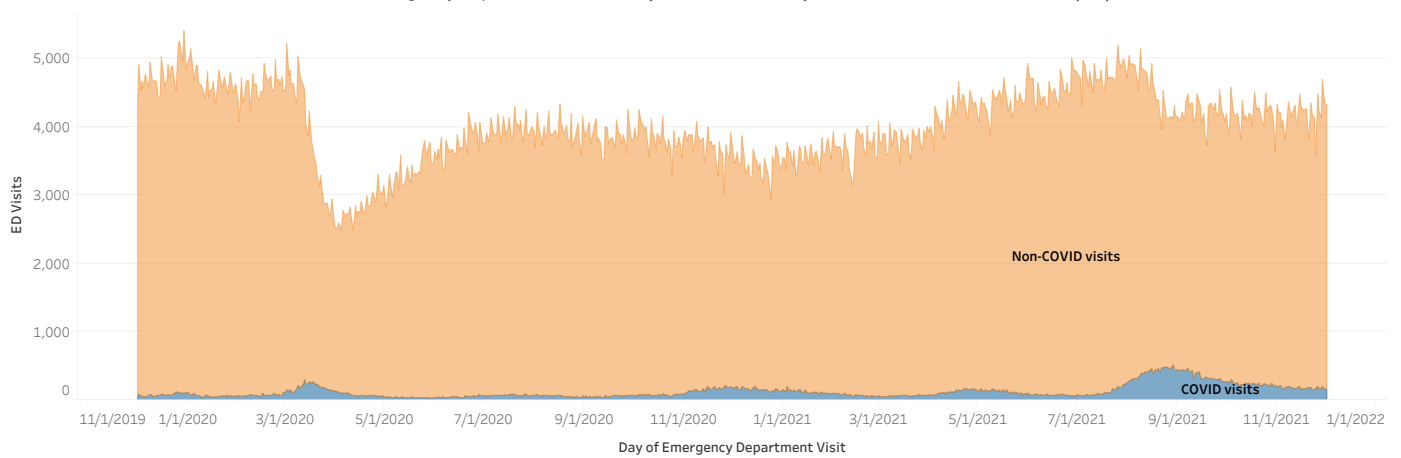
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### Emergency department visits in Oregon for COVID-19-like illness peaked in late August 2021 and are declining

This chart shows the number of statewide emergency department visits daily and whether they were for COVID-19-like illness (CLI).



#### Notes

Data are from Oregon's Electronic Surveillance System for the Early Notification of Community-based Epidemics (ESSENCE), which allows for public health to monitor what is happening in emergency departments across the state. Oregon ESSENCE receives daily reports of ED visits from all 60 non-federal hospitals in Oregon. Data are provisional and subject to change.
